

Rookie of the Year

Myriam is the 17 year-old daughter of Paul and Odette Cyr of Abram-Village.

A grade 11 student at Evangeline School, Myriam began running in the sixth grade as a member of her school's cross country team. Now running competitively since the ninth grade when she attended the Legion National Track and Field Championships in Charlottetown, Myriam was a member of the latest PEI delegation at the 2013 Canada Games, running in the 800 and 1500 meter race.

While preparing for those games, she showed her versatility on the track by breaking the midget girls' 3000 meter PEISAA record in a time of 10min 51 seconds.

Also, she attended many of the PEI Roadrunner races (mostly between 5 and 10k) to work on her endurance, and found success while doing so.

Raised in a household where sports were very present, she only became a Roadrunner member in 2013, having focused on other sports such as hockey and soccer beforehand. Now a full-time runner, Myriam exhibits the skill and drive coupled with a clear vision of her future goals to assure her improvement in races ranging from the 800 meter up to the 10k.



Myriam was top female at the The Bunny Hop 10K, 39:09 Kent Run (7K), 27:38ADL Golden Mile 5:38 Friendship Run (10K) 42:11. She was top female at the Boardwalk Boogie (6K), 24:00 PEI Law Enforcement Annual Torch Run for Special Olympics (5k), 20:16 and won the WR3 10K, 1st place overall in 41:03, making her top female in all but 1 of the 8 races she ran.
